Guidance for this examination

Please ensure that you indicate clearly, at the top of the answer booklet, the law viewpoint from which you will be answering: English, Scottish or Welsh.

The examiners may expect candidates to show knowledge of legislation which is in place but not in force (i.e. has been enacted) and regulations which have been made but are not yet in force, if they are directly relevant to the subject-matter of the examination.

Examination structure

There are two sections to the examination paper:

Section A Consists of six questions.

Candidates should attempt to answer four questions.

Total allocation of marks is 40 marks. Suggested time allocation is 30 minutes.

Section B Consists of four questions.

Candidates should attempt to answer two questions.

Total allocation of marks is 60 marks. Suggested time allocation is 60 minutes.

Total time allowed – one hour 30 minutes (plus ten minutes' reading time).
